Tips for Safe Grill Cleaning

Extend the lifespan of your grill and cooking grates, and ensure backyard barbecues are safe. It's easy to do by using proper equipment and cleaning it or replacing it as needed. After all, stainless steel bristles from a grill brush can be a hazard if it ends up on your grill and in your food. No need for that to happen, though, when you use a few tips.

Basically, you should take the same care cleaning your tools for outdoor grilling as you do in the kitchen. Use a good grill cleaning brush, use it often to properly clean your grill and replace it regularly.

- ✓ Use the same rule with grill brushes as you do for your toothbrush: Change them out every three months. If the bristles look bad, it needs to go.
- ✓ If the plastic head shows signs of melting, it's time to replace.
- ✓ If your grill brush is caked with an unidentifiable black, tar-like material with bristles that meander in every direction, swap it out.
